There will be a book of remembrance in Lynn's office this week and her family would very much like you to share your memories of Hilary.

Today is doubly sad, because Ian Gatward's funeral will take place at the same time **1530, Monday 12th November**, at Macclesfield Crematorium, following his tragic death three weeks ago from injuries sustained in a cycling accident. Ian's family would also welcome anyone who would like to attend the funeral. Like Hilary, Ian had given many years of valued service to the School, and will be very much missed by friends and colleagues.

Research Students' Symposium

Thanks to everyone involved in organising and participating in another successful event. We had ten nominations for the 2007 Best PhD Paper prize, which is a record, and the quality of the nominations was on a par with the very best years in the past. The winning paper was "*Finite Products are Biproducts in a Compact Closed Category*" by Robin Houston which appeared in the Journal of Pure and Applied Algebra. Second was Gwenn Englebienne's paper on "*A Probabilistic Model for Generating Realistic Lip Movements from Speech*" with Tim Cootes and Magnus Rattray, published in the Proceedings of the 21st Annual Conference on Neural Information Processing Systems. Third was Caroline Jay's paper on "*Modeling the Effects of Delayed Haptic and Visual Feedback in a Collaborative Virtual Environment*" with Mashhuda Glencross and Roger Hubbard, which appeared in ACM Transactions on Computer-Human Interaction. All these students and their supervisors are to be congratulated on their excellent work.

The 2007 Best PhD Dissertation prize was awarded to Gilles Daniel, now holding a joint position at ETH Zürich and the UBS Investment Bank for his thesis "*Asynchronous Simulations of a Limit Order Book*". The dissertation will be submitted for the UK-wide BCS Distinguished Dissertation Award, along with Xuejun Liu's outstanding dissertation "*Microarray Data Analysis Using Probabilistic Methods*".

Plagiarism Interest Group

On Wednesday 7 November the School hosted a meeting of the Plagiarism

Interest Group, an informal grouping of colleagues across the University who share an interest in detecting plagiarism and academic malpractice at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, and in educating students against plagiarism. The meeting was addressed by Dr Keith Elliott, Head of Learning Development, and was attended by 25 colleagues from across the University. Teaching Java to Thirteen-year-olds

Remarkably, the students progressed at a pace comparable with that expected of a first year student, demonstrating an impressive ability to cope with challenging computing tasks. Thanks go to those involved, including also Amanda Banks and Pete Jinks who helped out, and especially the staff at the City Learning Centre who enthusiastically hosted the event.

NaCTeM Follow-on Funding

Congratulations to Sophia Ananiadou and colleagues who have secured funding of over £1.8M from JISC to support the National Centre for Text Mining for another three years. NaCTeM is an important vehicle for building collaboration with colleagues in other disciplines, and its continuation is a major fillip for the School.
