This study establishes a computational resource of the human metabolic content. This allows a mapping from the human genome to proteins and small molecules and essentially forms a blueprint of how they work together in different human cells. The resource contains principled annotations in RDF format and is the result of a 5-year long community annotation process led by University of Manchester, University of Iceland and UCSD.
